Summer Camp at WLD Ranch is an experience your campers won't soon forget. The unique mix of friendship building, focused learning, faith development, and fun activities gives your campers a taste of life at its fullest. WLD summer staff will welcome your campers into camp life and return them to you with memories that will last a lifetime.

Traditional overnight camps, specialty camps, and day camps throughout June, July, and August give you the opportunity to select just the right camp for your campers. Kids from Kindergarten to 12th grade can participate in age appropriate Round-ups. We also offer our Family Camp for campers of all ages. Which Round-ups will work for your family?

Traditional Overnight Camps (Round-ups #2, #3, #4, and #5)

Our traditional overnight camps offer a balance of learning, games, and other activities that allow campers from Kindergarten through High School to experience WLD Ranch to the fullest. Our traditional overnight camps include 6-Day/5-Night camps for Juniors and Teens and 3-Day/2-Night camps for Pre-Juniors.

6-Day/5-Night Camps (Junior and Teen camps)

Round-ups #2, #3, and #4

WLD Ranch's Six Day/Five Night Round-ups give campers a full week of Activity Class, Bible lessons, swimming, games, and more! You can also look forward to skit night, campfires, and hayrides. Each evening, Junior Camps feature guest speakers who know how to connect and interact with junior campers. Our Junior Camp speakers are Daniel Helmbrecht (Round-up #2) and Matt Pushinsky (Round-up #4). During Teen Week, Steve Pettis, a familiar face at the Ranch for many years and the originator of the Adventure Team chant, will speak to the teens again each evening. Also during Teen Week, we will have 4 different Theme Nights: Pirates and Princesses, Scottish Highlands, Clue (the board game), and July 4th, 1776.

Each 6-Day Camp (Round-up #2, #3, and #4) runs from Sunday 6:00pm through Friday 5:30pm. Everyone is welcome to stay for our rodeos that follow these camps on Fridays at 6:30pm.

3-Day/2-Night Camp (Pre-junior camp)

Round-up #5

WLD Ranch's Three Day/Two Night Round-up has been designed with our younger campers (and their parents) in mind. By considering the needs of the children in this age group, we are able to give campers a "well rounded" taste of camp life. Campers will sample activities such as horse rides, challenge course activities, Bible Round-Up, swimming, archery, and more. Group activities, freetime events, and Bible lessons are all aimed at meeting the needs of our younger campers. (See below for the day camp option for Pre-juniors.)

Round-up #5 (Pre-junior) runs Sunday 6:00pm through Tuesday 5:30pm. Everyone is welcome to stay for our rodeo that follows this camp on Tuesday at 6:30pm.

Specialty Camps (Round-ups #1 and #7)

Due to the intensity of our Specialty Camps, we may require a personal interview with those who register for a Specialty Camp before they are accepted into the Specialty Camp.

Specialty Camps allow junior high and teen campers to spend additional time in their chosen skill area. Typically, mornings are devoted to specialty classes while afternoons allow for optional activities. Evenings involve camp-wide activities such as games and Bible discussion groups. Round-up #1 is available to junior high campers (grades 6-9). Round-up #7 is available to teen campers (grades 8-12). Each camper must choose to specialize in **one** of these three options: Wrangler Week, Adventure Camp, or Target Sports Camp. See each description on the next page for specific offerings.

Both Round-up #1 and #7 run from Sunday 6:00pm through Friday 5:30pm. Everyone is welcome to stay for our rodeos that follow these camps on Fridays at 6:30pm.

Wrangler Week

Our Wrangler Weeks are designed for the ultimate horse lover. While many other activities are included during this week, the emphasis is on horses – learning more about them and improving your riding skills with twice as much horse time as a regular week of camp. (NOTE: Campers new to our Horsemanship program are welcome to attend RU#1. Round-up #7 is for campers who have already taken some Horsemanship classes or Horse Riding Lessons at WLD Ranch.)

Adventure Camp

Junior High Adventure Camp (RU#1) is designed for those who want adventure but also a chance to relax and enjoy traditional camp activities. This camp (based entirely at WLD) will include our low element challenge course, bouldering, canoeing, mountainboarding, and more! Teen Adventure Camp (RU#7) will include lively adventures on and off WLD Ranch property. This camp will include challenge courses, rappelling, harnessed tree climbing, canoeing, orienteering, and more.

Target Sports Camp

This specialty focuses on developing skills in traditional target sports, including archery (recurve bows), tomahawk throwing, and riflery (.22 bolt action rifles). Campers will learn safety and proper handling procedures, improve their aiming and accuracy, and enjoy hands-on demonstrations from guest presenters (may include other actions and

calibers of rifles and handguns, shotguns, muzzleloading, and other types of bows).

Day Camps (Round-ups #3D, #5D, and #8D)

Our day camps offer an alternative for those who would like to experience camp without staying the night. Each day camp includes activity classes, Bible lessons, lunch, afternoon freetime activities, and games. *Please use the separate Day Camp registration form to sign up for these camps.*

Junior High Day Camp (gr. 6-8)

Run alongside the Teen overnight camp (RU#3), day campers will join the overnight campers for most activities (Bible Round-Up, activity classes, lunch, and freetime activities), but will begin and end the day with the other day campers on the blacktop. Day campers will join the overnight campers for activity classes, so choose from adventure team, archery, horsemanship, pioneer crafts, and riflery. On Monday through Thursday, campers should eat breakfast and supper at home (we provide only lunch). On Friday, campers may join us for breakfast at 9am and supper at 5pm.

Round-up #3D runs during the day on Monday through Friday, July 5-9. Each day, arrival time (drop off) is between 8:30am and 9:15am. On Monday through Thursday, departure time (pick up) is between 4pm and 5pm. On Friday, departure time (pick up) is between 5:30pm and 6:15pm. Everyone is welcome to stay for our rodeo that follows this camp on Friday at 6:30pm.

Junior Day Camp (gr. 3-7)

This day camp is available on August 9-13 for campers going into grades 3-7. The program will begin at 9:00am and end at 4:00pm. In the morning, we will focus on specialty classes and Bible Round Up. Day campers can choose either *horse day camp* or *adventure day camp*. The horse day camp is open to new horsemanship students and those returning for the Cowpoke, Buckaroo, and Cowboy levels of our horsemanship program (more advanced levels should choose a different week of camp or expect to repeat a level). The adventure day camp will include activities such as our low element challenge course, canoeing, and the bouldering wall. In the afternoon, campers will enjoy traditional free time activities (swimming, archery, game room, and more). Friday will feature a rotation of activities such as wagon rides, hayrides, crafts, and more. Lunch is provided each day.

Round-up #8D runs during the day on Monday through Friday, August 9-13. Arrival time (drop off) is between 8am and 9am. Departure time (pick up) is between 4pm and 5pm.

Pre-junior Day Camp (K-gr. 4)

Run alongside the Pre-junior overnight camp (RU#5), this day camp allows our youngest campers to get a first-time exposure to camp while still enjoying the comforts of home at night. Day campers will join the overnight campers throughout the day for horse rides, challenge course activities, Bible Round Up, swimming, archery, and more. On Monday, day campers should eat breakfast and supper at home. On Tuesday, day campers should eat breakfast at home but may join us for supper at 5pm (check-out is 5:30-6:15 on Tuesday). We provide lunch on both days.

Round-up #5D runs during the day on Monday and Tuesday, July 19-20. Each day, arrival time (drop off) is between 8:30am and 9:15am. On Monday departure time (pick up) is between 4:30pm and 5:15pm. On Tuesday, departure time (pick up) is between 5:30pm and 6:15pm. Everyone is welcome to stay for our rodeo that follows this camp on Tuesday at 6:30pm.

Adventure Trip (Round-up #9)

If you are entering grades 10-12, we'd love to have you join us for a Pennsylvanian adventure. We'll experience the beauty of our state up close and personal as we canoe on the Clarion River, hike in the Allegheny mountains, and scamper around on the boulders of the Allegheny National Forest. We will depart from WLD Monday morning and return to WLD Wednesday afternoon. Expect to camp outdoors both nights of this adventure. We will spend time each day reflecting on our place in God's world and how following Jesus makes the most sense out of life. Because space is limited and because of the nature of this adventure trip, a personal interview will be required before approving your registration. A detailed list of what to bring will be provided after your registration is processed.

Round-up #9 runs from Monday, August 16, at 9:00am through Wednesday, August 18, at 5:00pm. Campers can arrive on Monday between 8:00am and 9:00am. Campers can be picked up on Wednesday between 5:00pm and 6:00pm.

Family Camp (Round-up #6)

Bring your whole family to summer camp! We are planning lots of WLD Ranch style family fun for the weekend of July 23-25. This year, our Family Camp will

kick off with our third annual Staff Alumni Rodeo. ***The rodeo will begin Friday at 7:00 pm*** (supper or snacks can be purchased at our Chuckwagon before and during the rodeo) and will be followed by an evening meeting for family campers and staff alumni as we celebrate how God has blessed us over the years. As the staff alumni who are not staying for family camp head home, the evening will round out with snacks around the campfire. Saturday and Sunday will be full of Ranch style family fun. Three meals on Saturday and two meals on Sunday are included. Activities will include hayrides, horse rides, family electives (may include canoeing, lasso and trick rope demonstrations, team challenge course, pioneer skills, and more), freetime activities (such as swimming and archery), lots of singing, evening meetings and morning devotions, and more. We're thrilled to have Unto Him, a men's gospel quartet, joining us for Family Camp this year, providing musical entertainment throughout the weekend, including a concert on Saturday night. Round-up #6 runs from Friday 6:00pm through Sunday 1:00pm. Families can arrive between 5:30pm and 6:15pm if they want to settle in their lodging before the rodeo. Anyone who arrives after 6:15pm should attend the rodeo and then sign in and settle in between 8:00pm and 8:30pm as we prepare for the evening meeting. Families should sign out and head home no later than 1:30pm on Sunday.

Staff Alumni Rodeo

Our third annual Staff Alumni Rodeo will be on Friday, July 23, at 7:00pm. Supper or snacks can be purchased at our Chuckwagon before and during the rodeo. An evening meeting will follow, celebrating how God has blessed us over the years. Since our Family Camp begins with the rodeo and goes through the weekend, Staff Alumni are encouraged to sign up for the Family Camp and stay the weekend! If you would rather just spend Friday evening with us, please let us know that you are coming so we know how to plan.
