Bible Round-Up (All camps) - "C.R.A.S.H. Course on Being a Child of God"

Throughout the week, campers meet with camp counselors in small groups or cabin groups to focus on the Bible Round-Up theme for the summer. This summer, we will turn to the Bible for a "C.R.A.S.H. Course on Being a Child of God." We will be learning about how being a child of God is much more than simply being able to call God our Heavenly Father. We will discuss the privilege it is to be Created, Redeemed, Adopted, Secured and Honored as God's children. As we take this C.R.A.S.H. course, we will learn how to grow in knowing Jesus as the Truth in life.

Chuckwagon (All camps)

WLD's Chuckwagon is once again full of the latest Ranch wear and souvenirs and the greatest snacks around, so campers should come prepared! (We recommend depositing camper money into the WLD Ranch bank for safe keeping. Then they can access their account at the Chuckwagon.)

Free time activities (All camps)

Campers will have many supervised free time activities to choose from during the afternoons (and some evenings), including swimming, archery, riflery, horse rides/trail rides, bouldering wall, mountainboards, game room, and more!

Skill Tracks – for Round-ups #2, 2D, 3, and 4

(Note: Trailblazer Round-ups have a separate list of skill track choices. Pre-junior campers will sample many of these tracks as part of their Pre-junior Camp experience.)

Campers attending the Pathfinder Junior or Teen camps and the Junior Day Camp must choose a Skill Track for their week of camp. Skill Tracks meet each morning except Friday. (Skill Tracks are limited in size and are first come, first served.)

Adventure Team: Learn to think creatively, to develop problem solving skills, to value teamwork, and to challenge yourself with a variety of adventure activities, including our challenge course, bouldering wall, canoeing, and more!

Archery: Learn about archery safety and work on developing precision and accuracy through target shooting and archery games. The class will use traditional recurve bows, but may have opportunities to shoot longbows and compound bows. They will also get to try their hand at tomahawks and atlatls.

Horsemanship: Learn the basics of riding and caring for horses. Through our sequential riding program, campers build on their knowledge and skills from year to year. (There is an additional fee of \$20.00 due at registration for RU#2, 2D, 3, or 4.)

Outdoor Survival Skills: Learn valuable skills such as tying knots, building campfires safely, using a map and compass, and identifying animal tracks.

Riflery: Learn about firearm safety and shooting techniques of .22 caliber rifles. We will focus on the fundamentals of rifle shooting in order to improve accuracy for each camper.
