WLD RANCH JOB DESCRIPTION

COUNSELOR

A counselor at WLD Ranch is a committed Christian young adult who provides personal interaction, supervision, and guidance of all campers in a safe, caring environment so that campers can enjoy their stay, develop relationships and skills, and grow in faith.

QUALIFICATIONS:

A counselor . . .

- 1. Has received Jesus Christ as Savior;
- 2. Is committed to being a servant of God and to developing godly character (Gal. 5:22-26);
- 3. Demonstrates Christian leadership and responsibility;
- 4. Has graduated from high school and is age 18-25;
- 5. Is in good health and is physically able to navigate outdoor terrain including steep hills and uneven surfaces without assistance
- 6. Must be female for female campers and male for male campers; and
- 7. Must be single.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- A. General Responsibilities
 - 1. A counselor must attend all **Staff Training** sessions.
 - 2. A counselor abides by all Ranch **policies** and rules.
 - 3. A counselor conducts himself or herself in a way that contributes to the **safety** of every person at the Ranch.
 - 4. A counselor conducts himself or herself in a way that contributes to the mental, social and emotional **well-being** of everyone at the Ranch.
 - 5. A counselor encourages the **spiritual life** of every person at the Ranch, especially through living your life for Christ.
 - 6. A counselor is responsible to the coordinators and program staff leadership (see Chain of Command).
- B. Responsibilities toward God
 - 1. A counselor prepares spiritually for camp (a servant's heart).
 - 2. A counselor develops his or her personal walk with God throughout the summer (Gal. 5:22-23).
- C. Responsibilities toward campers
 - 1. A counselor supervises his or her cabin of campers.
 - a. Welcome campers and parents as they arrive; introduce campers to other campers, leaders, facilities, expectations, etc.
 - b. Stay overnight in the cabin with your campers (providing safety, supervision and care).
 - c. Help campers arrive on time to meals, group activities, back to the cabin, etc.
 - d. Oversee cabin activities (daily clean-up times, etc.).
 - e. Oversee your cabin at group activities (flag-raising, bonfires, etc.).
 - f. Supervise final clean-up, packing, and orderly departure of all campers in your cabin.
 - 2. A counselor guides campers toward Christ through biblical instruction and testimony.
 - a. Teach Bible Round-Up daily to your cabin (lessons and training given at orientation).
 - b. Lead nightly devotions with your cabin.
 - c. Give a personal life testimony once a week to the camp.
 - d. Play a biblical character in the Bible Walk each Friday.
 - 3. A counselor supervises and teaches an activity class each day (trained for this during staff training and orientation).
 - 4. A counselor supervises campers' free-time activity (usually assigned to an activity site).

- 5. A counselor generally watches over and cares for all campers throughout the week and in the various programs (campfires, hayrides, games, meetings, etc.).
 - a. Must be able to visually observe campers during their daily routine.
 - b. Must be able to audibly hear campers and verbally communicate with campers.
 - c. Must be able to physically keep up with the campers during their daily routine.
- 6. A counselor interacts personally with each of his or her campers to get to know them and to develop a camper's spiritual, mental, emotional, and social well-being.
- 7. A counselor is responsible for maintaining discipline and managing conflicts among campers according to specific guidelines provided during staff training. This includes seeking help from leadership staff.

D. Responsibilities toward other staff

- 1. A counselor respects other staff members and abides by mutually agreed upon staff policies.
- 2. A counselor works together with the staff to provide a beneficial experience for campers.
- 3. A counselor strives to maintain unity in Christ. This means to live and work in peace with others who may differ from us in gifts, backgrounds, tasks, etc.
- 4. A counselor makes peace with other staff members when he or she is involved in conflict.
- 5. A counselor carries out normal responsibilities and additional tasks as assigned by program staff leadership.
- A counselor meets with Director and/or program staff leadership for evaluation and discussion as needed.
- 7. Following the close of a camp session, a counselor is responsible for cleaning the bunkhouse, collecting lost and found items, and returning supplies to their proper place. A counselor must also check out with program staff leadership before leaving for day-off.
- 8. At the end of summer, a counselor is responsible for final cleaning and returning all supplies to office.

E. Responsibilities toward yourself

- 1. A counselor maintains physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual health throughout the summer. Avoid actions and attitudes that will hinder you from carrying out your responsibilities.
- 2. A counselor is aware of his or her physical health and notifies the nurse of any personal illness or injury.
- 3. A counselor uses time off and hours off wisely.
